In 2006, the family and friends of Curtis Marcum could not foresee the lives that would be changed by their generosity in establishing the Curtis Marcum Memorial Endowment Fund. Curtis is remembered for his love of reading and animals, and the fund created in his memory continues to benefit the New Castle-Henry County Public Library (NCHCPL) and the Henry County Humane Society.

With help from Curtis' fund, both of these organizations have come together to form something extraordinary, creating a ripple effect.

Lucky the dog is truly a lucky dog. Rescued by the Henry County Humane Society from a life of neglect and abuse, Lucky found himself in the home of New Castle Police Captain Brad Flynn and wife, Aimee Flynn, a third grade teacher at Westwood Elementary. Bringing him back to health opened the doors for him to touch the lives of many.

While exercising Lucky around Baker Park, the Flynns noticed Lucky's keen interest in the participants of the local Special Olympic team. After walking him over to visit with the

players, their families and the volunteers, they realized his potential. Lucky became a licensed therapy dog in July 2014. Since then he visits athletes who are physically and cognitively challenged at Miracle League practices and participates in the New Castle-Henry County Public Library children's reading program.

"Lucky thinks the world revolves around him and he lives on the attention of people," Brad says, as he pauses walking while Lucky greets some people passing by. "He loves people and if it weren't for the Humane Society and organizations like Special Olympics, Miracle League and the library, he would not be able to bring happiness to so many people."

Lucky is an example to the power of funds like the Curtis Marcum Memorial Endowment Fund. With an accumulation of fund payouts Lucky the dog was able to showcase his talents after he was adopted by Brad and Aimee Flynn from the Henry County Humane Society/New Castle Animal Shelter. Prior to his stay at the shelter, Lucky was rescued from a life of abuse. After the Flynns discovered Lucky had a keen interest in children, he became a licensed therapy dog and listens to children read at the library and is an active partner with participants of the local Miracle League team.

and donations, dogs such as Lucky are given second chances at life through the Humane Society,

and the library can provide important literacy programs for our citizens starting from birth through adulthood.

"Library staff are very appreciative of the funds we receive from the Henry County Community Foundation," says NCHCPL Director, Winnie Logan. "One of our biggest yearly programs is Summer Reading. Although it is for all ages, we know how important it is to keep kids reading and engaged with learning throughout the summer to help with their progress in the coming school year. Foundation funds allow us to expand the program offerings that we are able to provide for the community to make our Summer Reading program one of the best attended programs offered at the library."

Working together to preserve a memory, rescue dogs, and help children, multiplies the lives touched by generosity.

TASC Teens About Serving the County

he TASC (Teens About Serving the County) Youth Grants Committee meets four times each school year. The TASC Committee includes one 8th grader, one freshman, one sophomore, one junior, and one senior from each of the five school districts in Henry County.

The TASC Committee assignment is to evaluate grant submissions relating to youth and educational programs. The Henry County Community Foundation, Inc. provides the TASC Committee with a budget from the Unrestricted Funds for Community Grants. Youth Grants Chairman, Bill Bergmann, as well as three Foundation board representatives, oversee the process and ensure basic parliamentary procedure is followed.

Along with the privilege of serving on the TASC Committee, these students accept the responsibility of critically evaluating each grant submission for purpose, scope, need, and viability. They then determine whether each grant will be accepted as is, partially funded, denied, or accepted with conditions. The TASC Committee grant recommendations are then taken to the Henry County Community Foundation Board of Directors for final approval.

Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship

Since 1998, Lilly Endowment has awarded scholarships to Henry County resident students to cover the cost of tuition to any Indiana college or university and \$900 each year for books.

In 2014, one more student was added to the thirty-two (32) who have previously been honored with the scholarships. Of the seven nominees only one was selected to be the Lilly scholar, with the remaining six receiving \$1,000 scholarships from the Henry County Community Foundation. All nominees are chosen by their respective high schools to be eligible for the scholarship. The final process is a forty-five minute interview with three judges from outside the county. Each

student is judged based on their academics, extracurricular activities and accomplishments, community involvement, and interview skills. The top choice and two alternates are submitted to Independent Colleges of Indiana, Inc. (ICI) for the final approval of the selection.

ICI is a nonprofit corporation that represents 31 regionally accredited degree granting, nonprofit, private colleges and universities in the state. The scholarships are the result of a state-wide Lilly Endowment Initiative to help Hoosier students reach high levels of education with the hopes they will stay in Indiana and even return to their hometowns to work and to live. There are over 200 scholarships awarded statewide annually.

Erin Bundy Pays it Forward to Knightstown

hilanthropy comes in all sizes as Bill Gates donates billions and a neighbor donates \$10. Philanthropists are made up of all ages. Warren Buffett is 84 years old and Erin Bundy is 20 years old, but each individual has one thing in common. They are both impacting their communities and the world.

Henry County's Lilly Scholar in 2013, Erin Bundy, is looking to transform the area of Knightstown through collective giving. Upon receiving word she was selected as the recipient of the Gold M Award, she was given the opportunity to direct \$5,000 to a charity of her choice. After careful consideration, Ms. Bundy elected to establish the "Knightstown Pay It Forward Community Fund" at the Henry County Community Foundation.

"I chose the focus of Knightstown because this community has helped shape me into the person that I am today and I wanted to 'pay it forward.' I want to give back to the community and help make our town a better place in any way that I can." said Bundy.

Bundy is no stranger to community service. During her high school career, she was a regular volunteer with the Cheer Guild, local blood drives and she also organized a visit with Santa for children to raise money

for charity. Her concern for the world around her was also evident when she created Step Forward for Haiti to provide shoes to those affected by the 2010 earthquake.

"A fund at the Foundation provides a permanent charitable resource that grows and provides much-needed funding to local nonprofit organizations. When you give to the endowment, you're helping to meet the needs of our community today, and for years to come," said Beverly Matthews, Henry County Community

Foundation president.

Bundy created the Field of Interest Fund which allows flexibility to meet the changing needs in the Knightstown community. "My vision for this fund is to be something that will be beneficial in a multitude of ways for a variety of groups and people so that it can help the entire community," explained Bundy. Grants will be given to non-profit organizations providing charitable services to the area of Knightstown and will be chosen by a local committee chosen by the Henry County Community Foundation.

Bundy is now calling upon her fellow citizens to pitch in and grow the endowment to provide more resources, "I think it is really important and hope that people will be involved with this fund because it is truly there to support everyone in the community. The more people are involved, the more people the fund will be able to reach...which will make it more beneficial overall."

former participant in the local Big Brothers Big Sisters program, Trevor Williamson, was inducted into Kappa Beta Delta International Business Honor Society in 2014. With the moral support of his Big Brother, Dan Yeager, during his youth, and scholarships from the Henry County Community Foundation, Williamson graduated in May with his second associates degree from Ivy Tech Community College.

Williamson was recognized at the annual Scholarship Benefactor Reception hosted by the Ivy Tech Foundation in Muncie on April 16, 2014. Speaking to the group of patrons, Ivy Tech administrators and other students, Williamson said, "This would not have been possible without the help of scholarships. As the son of a hard working single parent, four-year colleges were all but out of bounds for me when I graduated high school. But I wanted a degree in the field that I loved – computers. It was then that I spoke with my high school computer teacher and he recommended Ivy Tech."

"Even though Ivy Tech had a significantly smaller tuition than other colleges it still wasn't affordable to me, so I sought out scholarships from the Henry County Community Foundation and Ivy Tech, and was able to start my college career," he added.

According to the Henry County Community Foundation, Williamson received assistance from the Opportunities Unlimited Scholarship, Ray Family Scholarship and Ray Pavy Spirit Scholarship.



"We are very proud of Trevor's accomplishments," said Beverly Matthews, president of the Henry County Community Foundation. "Donors who establish scholarships and those who contributed to these scholarships are seeing their intentions of helping local students succeed in life being fulfilled."

After completing degrees in digital information security and information technology, Williamson began pursuing a bachelor's degree in computer information technology at Ball State University in the fall.

"This would not have been possible without the good Lord above, my mother and grandmother, and the Henry County Community Foundation scholarships I received. The people who donate to the scholarships are wonderful and have given students like me the chance to change our lives. I personally say thank you," Williamson told the audience.

They stay connected to the place they love through the Foundation

Ve chose to be part of the Henry County Community Foundation because we can never forget New Castle. Some people say you can never go home again but the truth is, we can always go home again," said Dick Riley, retired insurance executive and 1960 New Castle High School graduate.

Dick and his wife, Carolyn, a 1961 New Castle High School graduate and former med-tech, can't forget their hometown and want to see it prosper. That's why they continue to support the community they love through the Henry County Community Foundation.

The Rileys have lived in many different places in the country throughout their careers and now reside in South Carolina, but they continue to come back to New Castle and support education and community improvement endeavors. They have been benefactors to the IU East Danielson Learning Center, New Castle Class of 1960 Scholarship, Henry County YMCA, Ivy Tech – Henry County Campus and most recently to the Unrestricted Fund for Community Grants.

"We know that when we give through the Foundation that money is going to multiply and it's going to continually be used for purposes we've designated and just like everyone else who gives to the Foundation, the whole thing is about keeping the community a good place to live and work and go to school," explained Carolyn.

Formative Years Led to Success

Growing up in a "golden time" for New Castle during their formative years in the

1950s - the community has influenced Dick and Carolyn their entire lives. "I thought the class of 1960 was the best class you could imagine," said Dick. We had a really good feeling about ourselves and a huge amount of class spirit. That's the reason I stay in touch with as many classmates as I can and Libby Edwards keeps us connected. Bill Baker was my best friend for many years and Ray Pavy is one of the greatest people I know. Another reason I come back is because Danny Danielson has become my friend and I've known him for about 12 years now and I wish I would have known him my whole life," he added. Those relationships help Dick and Carolyn stay connected and even ended up with Dick becoming a board member on the IU East Danielson Learning Center Advisory Committee.

The Rileys haven't lived in New Castle since they were 18 years old but they still consider themselves "Hoosiers." They believe their upbringing helped them in their lives and want to share their success with the community. Visits remain steady because Carolyn's family still lives in the community.

The Rileys discovered the best way to invest in their hometown community was through the strength of the Foundation – who has given away over \$17M in grants back to the community since 1985. In response to a Lilly Endowment Inc. match opportunity to grow assets in the Foundation's Unrestricted Fund for Community Grants, the Rileys wanted to help build the fund they believe can help the community most. *(continued)*

2014 Judy Melton Award Recipient Morris Edwards

New Castle native Morris Edwards was honored by the Henry County Community Foundation (HCCF) during the 2014 Annual Meeting when HCCF president, Beverly Matthews, announced him as the Judy Melton Award recipient.

"I am so grateful to have had the opportunity to serve and help raise the money needed to do good works in Henry County and hope to continue to do so," Edwards said, adding that he is pleased with the work of the Foundation and that he is proud to have done his part.

Edwards helped establish the local community foundation and was one of the original members of its board of directors. He also is a former president of the HCCF Board.

His family owned Edwards Jewelry Store in downtown New Castle for many years, and his uncle, John Morris, was a longtime local judge. Matthews said he not only helped get the Foundation up and running but has also been an integral part of its growth and success over the years.

Judy Melton was a past president and board member of the HCCF. Matthews described her as a "tireless volunteer" who used her skills as an English teacher to produce the formal communications published by the Foundation. She also wrote many successful grants.

Melton was involved with the Foundation from 1993 to 2005 and died in 2009. A memorial plaque with her engraved likeness in the Foundation office is a reminder that commitment and hard work have paved the way for the organization's success. The award named in



her honor recognizes others who go above and beyond expectations.

Matthews explained that the HCCF board of directors annually selects an individual who exemplifies Melton's qualities. The recipient's name is engraved on Melton's plaque.

"This year's winner has never stopped promoting the Foundation, continues reaching out to donors, maintains relations with long-time supporters and has a long history of family business and service in New Castle," she said.

"He has been committed to the Foundation since its formation, serving as board president and continuing to serve as a vital committee member. He remains dedicated to building assets to improve life in Henry County. Because he still asks for others to contribute and many times offers to match donations, the Foundation receives the gifts from his influence and we

Two runners-up each took home \$225. They were Healthy Communities of Henry County and Friends of Sunset Park of Knightstown. Beverly also presented \$670 from the Women's Circle Endowment Fund to the Interlocal Community Action Program for the Women and Child Clinic.

Moments after accepting the night's largest monetary award, Jeff Morton, board chair of the men's shelter, said winning was fantastic. "I just never knew there was such a great need in the county (for a men's shelter). We're just very grateful."

It's a need that Morton learned to appreciate. Morton explained that some of the men who stay there literally have no other place to go. Some have been released from prison and have been known to sleep on the ground behind a local church. The Guest House goals for the men include a four-point plan: 1. Provide emergency food and shelter for homeless men. 2. Teach them life skills in a healthy, safe environment. 3. Offer the life-saving, life-changing message of Jesus Christ. 4. Help them find jobs.

He says of the men currently at the shelter, almost all are working. Transporta-

> tion is provided along with training and education. A long-term goal is to find permathem nent housing.

There is governno ment other funding other than donations from

churches and people with the same passion as those who volunteer for The Guest House. The Women's Circle of Friends monetary award will go toward operational expenses.

Encouraged by the event was Joyce Miller of New Castle. "I just think if you can get a group of women motivated to improve a situation, they'll get it done." She said New Castle is her hometown. "I still believe in it," she added, saying that there are a lot of not-for-profits at work.





Ways to Contribute

Many have found that a fitting way to remember a special someone is through a gift in memory or in honor of that person. During times of great sorrow and times of great joy we look for ways to honor those who are dear to us. The Unrestricted Fund for Community Grants provides an opportunity to preserve their memories while supporting the community that we all love so dearly. A gift in memory of or in honor of a loved one contributes to a bright future while remembering our past.

Cash You may add to an existing philanthropic fund or create a new philanthropic fund.

Stocks and Bonds You receive a charitable tax deduction of the current value. If the securities have appreciated in value since purchased, you pay no capital gains tax.

Life Insurance You assign the policy and beneficiary right to the Henry County Community Foundation, Inc. It can be a fitting memorial for a spouse who has preceded you in death. The match and charitable tax deduction will be the lesser of the cost or cash value of the policy. If the donor continues to pay annual premiums, these too are tax deductible. The future benefit to the Foundation will be equal to the face value of the policy.

Charitable Remainder Trust

If you are the beneficiary of a trust which pays you a regular income, you may assign a portion of the income to the Henry County Community Foundation. You pay no further tax on the income and may take an income tax deduction for the value of the assignment. You establish a trust of some of your assets. You receive a charitable tax deduction for the remainder value as determined by IRS regulations, and estate taxes will be reduced upon your death. You and your designated family will receive an income for life. The remainder goes to the Henry County Community Foundation upon the death of the beneficiary.

Will You may add a codicil to your will, naming the Henry County Community Foundation and describing your gift. The value of the bequest will not be subject to estate taxes. Your gift will continue your vital involvement in the future lives of residents of Henry County.

Charitable Lead Trust You may give your assets to the Henry County Community Foundation for a designated period. The income is available for grants. After this period, the property in trust can be returned to you or your estate. You pay no income or capital gains taxes during the period of control by the Foundation of these assets.
